During that day, our child protection advocate, Joyce Azzam, offered a motivational speech to reinforce the importance of community-based activities and to encourage them to never-give-up on their dreams.

After lunch, animators from different regions gathered into small groups, to benefit from team building activities which helped strengthen the bonds between them.

This event was organized in partnership with UNICEF Lebanon, with the generous support of ISS, BPRM and DFID.

On September 5th, himaya inaugurated its 17th Safe Park in Chiyah with the support of the local municipality.

Families and children of all ages gathered to celebrate the opening ceremony where they enjoyed fun activities from animation, to face painting, shows, and games.

This newly established Safe Park is one of 17 safe parks distributed across Lebanon; the park offers a safe space for children to play in a child-friendly and safe environment.

Trained animators from the local community will provide recreational activities all year long and refer children to needed services with the support of UNICEF Lebanon.

This project was initiated by ISS with the support of UNICEF, funded by UK Aid and European Union; and wouldn't be possible without the engagement and endorsement of municipalities and the local communities.

Success story of 7 children who have been reunited with their families.

Our resilience team in South Lebanon has been working actively on cross-border cases, helping seven children reunite with their families whom they have not been in contact with for the past two years.

These children and their families were reunited safely in Germany with the support of the ISS team in Germany, UNHCR Lebanon, and the German embassy in Lebanon.

Since 2016, himaya intervenes with cross-border cases in safeguarding the best interest of the children and assisting with the following services:

- Re-establish contact between the child and the parent and engage in mediation for potential reunification.
- Mediate between parents when one of them lost contact with their child after he/she was taken to a different country with or without the knowledge or consent of the other parent.
- Trace parents or children in Lebanon and help establish communication between the child and his/her family.
- Provide psycho-social support to families.
