conducted by KAFA, Save The Children and the Ministry of Social Affairs in 2008, examining the occurrence of child abuse in Lebanon showed that:

1 OUT OF 6 CHILDREN IN LEBANON IS SUBJECTED TO A FORM OF SEXUAL ABUSE



Child Abuse refers to all forms of behavior and actions that result in actual or potential harm to a child's health, development or dignity. It includes 4 types:

- Physical
- Sexual
- Psychological
- Neglect

To promote an environment suitable for the development of children and ensure their global protection via fighting and preventing child abuse.





This is why we have created and constructed a network of child protection agents spread out across Lebanon.







RESILIENCE PROGRAM



Our **Resilience Program** intervenes with the child subjected to abuse by:

- Assessing the risk of abuse, the vulnerability
 of the child, the resources of the family and the
 opportunities in the surrounding environment
- Protecting the child from being exposed to further abuse in his/her environment
- Providing psychosocial and legal support to the child and his/her family
- Strengthening the resilience of the child and his/her family to overcome abuse in individual and group settings by offering tailored intervention plans
- Intervening in between countries to protect foreign children on Lebanese territory and children with dual nationalities who are subjected to abuse





Our **Resilience Program** follows 4 key principles through **A Child and Family Centered Approach**

- Survival and development
- Non discrimination
- Child participation
- Best interest determination

The **specialized resilience team** is composed of:


- Psychologists

NUMBER OF CASES REACHED IN 2020 THROUGH THE RESILIENCE PROGRAM










During 2020, a total of **2293 new cases** were received and assessed on a monthly basis in all offices as our hotlines were highly solicited notably after the Beirut blast.


The Resilience Team collaborated with ISS partners on **18 cross-border cases** (from Germany, UK, Australia, Canada, France, Switzerland, Netherlands, Belgium, and Cyprus). We were able to support 25 children (12 families) with welfare assessment, tracing for biological caregiver, kinship assessment and counselling on obtaining papers.


The team was also able to recommend **4 families out of 13 for inter-country family reunification**, thanks to himaya's partnership with UNHCR.













PER AGE RANGE

PER RISK LEVEL






PER GENDER



LEGAL UNIT



Our **Legal Unit** works on:

- The amendments of child protection and alternative care laws in Lebanon, mainly law 422/2002 on the Protection of Juveniles in Conflict with the Law and/or at Risk
- The implementation of a pilot project on family-based alternative care

In 2018, himaya signed a contract with the Ministry of Justice and has become **mandated to handle legal protection cases in the North Governorate**.


The legal Unit and the Resilience Program ensured **a safe placement with families for 27 children** throughout 2020. Himaya provided them with support on different levels: psychological, social, special needs, baby needs, medical, and other in-kind donations.














PER RISK LEVEL

PER TYPE OF ABUSE




The Legal Protection Unit in the North handled **417 cases of child abuse** in 2020.

209 new cases were received in 2020, in **76%** of those cases, the perpetrator was a member of the victim's family.

46.8% of child abuse high risk cases were at risk of separation from their parents/caregivers.

Following the judicial decision and himaya's legal intervention, family separation was prevented in **65.3%** of the cases.

34.7% of the children were separated from their parents/caregivers, **41.1%** benefited from family-based placements and **58.9%** were placed in residential care (20 out of 34 children)

CAPACITY BUILDING & RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT



Our CBRD Department works on:

- Developing the skills of professionals working with children by providing them with specialized training sessions and workshops related to child protection
- Developing Child Protection Policies for organizations to support them in preventing violence against children and responding to child protection concerns by setting clear procedures and guidelines with all stakeholders within the organization
- Aligning himaya's programs with best practices, as well as innovative and research-based approaches, and contributes to advancing research in the child protection sector in Lebanon

In 2020, CBRD integrated new content to the training sessions usually given, which include:

ONLINE SAFETY

Given the additional risks online since children are now more and more learning remotely.

TRAUMA SENSITIVITY

Dealing with children suffering from emotional distress and/or trauma given the many traumatic events of 2020.


